#### ST.WALSTAN PRAY FOR US

We are fortunate in having not one but two local saints. St.Withburga, of course, who lived and prayed in Dereham back in the eighth century, and whose feast we keep next month. But also St.Walstan, whose feast we celebrated last Friday. Walstan is unusual in that he was not a bishop, a king, a monk, or a scholar, but a farm labourer, who attained great holiness by leading a very simple way of life. He probably lived in the eleventh century, somewhere around Costessey. After death, his body was enshrined at Bawburgh, where a holy well still exists, just below the parish church. He was a very popular saint in mediaeval East Anglia, and many farmers and farm workers would flock to his shrine on June 30th, to seek his blessing on their work. He demonstrated that true holiness – which is a great love for God and for those around one – can be achieved in any way of life, however simple. He made an impact on his generation which has never been forgotten.

It is good that his feast falls around the time when we are celebrating the Ascension of Our Lord. For the Ascension of Jesus into heaven in the sight of his apostles teaches us where our attention and hopes should be fixed. We recognize that the values we should live by are those of the Christ who reigns in heaven, and we remember that we are working to achieve a place in heaven ourselves, with our ascended Lord. As a devout Christian, and one possessing extraordinary spiritual gifts, heaven and the ascended Christ must have been the goal, the aim, the hope, and the inspiration of St.Walstan. His life as a farm labourer in the eleventh century would have been gruelling. He must often have been cold and hungry, tired, and maybe dispirited. But he was sustained by his Christian faith and hope. He looked forward to the fulfillment of Christ's promise to 'take you to myself, that where I am, you may be also'. Walstan looked upward, not downward, and we who keep this feast of the Ascension of the Lord seek to do likewise.
