THE CONCLUSION OF THE CAFÉ COURSE

The Course, one of the best we've had, came to an end last Tuesday, when we looked at the life and teaching of St. Therese of Lisieux, who died as comparatively recently as 1897. Living well within the age of photography, her face is wellknown to us, and we can experience the extraordinary penetration of her eyes. In photographs, she is always looking directly at the viewer, and seems to be challenging and encouraging us in equal measure. We pondered together on how this sickly young woman in provincial France, dying in her twenties, and never having left her Convent after she entered Carmel at the age of fifteen, has come to exert such an extraordinary influence on the Church throughout the world. And how it is that so many of us feel a very real bond of affection with her, - indeed feeling that she is somehow a personal friend to us. It is indeed extraordinary. But then the Saints are extraordinary. And they are also our friends ; friends to whom we can turn in times of need and difficulty, and who, in heaven, care deeply about the welfare of us, their younger and weaker brothers and sisters within God's family.

I think we see in St. Therese how real humilty and gentleness are never to be confused with weakness. Therese, yes, was filled with a burning love for Our Lord Jesus Christ, and for her Sisters – not all of whom treated her with kindness and understanding. But there was an iron detemination in her to persevere to the end, and this determination and child-like faith carried her through the terrible trials of the latter part of her life, when she was suffering acutely from the effects of tuberculosis, and also enduring a time of distressing spiritual darkness.

St. Therese of Lisiuex was an excellent saint for us to end the Course with. She exemplifies so well that definition of a saint as someone with a heroic love for God, and for those around him or her. She reminds us that we mustn't expect discipleship to be easy, but she also assures us that true joy and peace are to be found in closeness to God.

ADVENT

It's New Year's Day! – well it is insofar as the Church's new year begins today, on Advent Sunday, when we begin the four-week period of preparation for celebrating the Incarnation and Birth of Our Lord. Advent is a solemn time of the year, hence in Church the use of the colour purple, and the absence of flowers. It is different, though, from Lent, and is not marked by the penitential exercise which we associate with that season. Good, though, if we seek to make this holy season of waiting and preparation a time of Listening ; listening more carefully to God's word at Mass, and in our private prayers. Most us talk too much, even in our prayers. Let's try to listen this Advent.
