THE YEAR OF FAITH

Today we begin the third part of our observance of the Year of Faith - our examination together of the doctrines of the Nicene Creed. Today and for the next eleven weeks Homilies on the individual clauses of the Creed will be given at Mass, and you are invited to participate not just by listening to these Homilies, but also by reflecting on what you have heard during the course of the following week, and by preparing for the next section by reading about the subject in the *CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH*. Here are the teachings as we will consider them week by week :

Week One *I believe in one God, the Father almighty*

Week Two *maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.*

Week Three *I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only-Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father ; through him all things were made.*

Week Four *For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man.*

Week Five *For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried,*

Week Six *and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.*

Week Seven *He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.*

Week Eight *I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the given of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.*

Week Nine *I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.*

Week Ten *I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins*

Week Eleven *and I look for the resurrection of the dead*

Week Twelve *and the life of the world to come. Amen.*

Try to be present as each of the twelve homilies is given, and then take away a copy of the digest of what has been said. Think about this during the week, and also use the material, perhaps, in your prayers. This week the thought of the mystery, the glory, and the Fatherhood of God should be useful for this.

Also during the week try to prepare for the next subject by reading the relevant paragraphs in the *CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH*. For next Sunday, they are paragraphs 279 – 349. Do you have a copy of the *CATECHISM*? If not, why not buy one to mark the Year of Faith? If you are not sure quite where to get one, consult the Internet or myself.

Finally, at Mass today you will be given an attractive card, which has on one side an icon of Christ, and on the other side the words of the Nicene Creed. Place this somewhere prominent in your home, to remind you of what we are undertaking together. It may also spark off some useful discussion with those who notice it!

ST. WITHBURGA

On Monday this week, July 8th, we keep the Feast of the patron saint of Dereham (Mass is at 9.0am). Daughter of Anna, King of East Anglia, she lived as a hermit at Holkham, where the parish church is dedicated to her, and later at Dereham, where she founded a community of nuns. She is thought to have died here in the year AD 743. Her emblem is a doe, which provided her with milk.
