There's a sense of 'back to normal', and for most of us that means a hum drum cycle of boring jobs and making ends meet. Today's story tells us that it doesn't have to be that way. To follow the star is to make a conscious decision to cut out everything that is unimportant. The rules are simple. We have to make the right choices on a daily basis no matter what the consequences. In the light of poor decisions, we must learn to ask forgiveness and move away from regret. We must find time in a world full of distractions to listen to our inner voice. Most importantly we have to ask God to guide us as he guided the Magi.

Most of us get through life relying on the knowledge we already have. Today's challenge is to look for something new. Knowing where to look for our own guiding star is up to us, but one thing is for sure, if we are not looking for revelation, we will never find it.

Please consider what you would like to be discussed and I ask all the parish groups to prepare their reports for the meeting. The date will be set when the Financial Report is ready for distribution. Proposed new Catholic schools in the Diocese - You may be aware that the Diocese is intending to submit bids to the government in March 2017, to open new Catholic schools across the Diocese from 2019 onwards. Primary schools are being proposed in Norwich, Cambridge, Peterborough and Thetford whilst a high school is being proposed in West Cambourne, Cambridgeshire and a sixth form in Norwich. The Diocese has set up a page on its website with more information about these proposals. There is also an opportunity on this website page to register your interest in these new schools, and this will also allow the Diocese to keep you updated on the proposals. It is very important that we get as many people as possible to register their interest on the website as this will provide strong evidence to the government of the need for Catholic schools in East Anglia. Recycle Your Christmas Cards 2017 - No! Don't just chuck your Christmas cards. You can recycle Your Christmas Cards with Marks & Spencer and The Woodland Trust. It's 19 years since The Woodland Trust started a scheme to collect Christmas cards for recycling and since then a whopping half a billion cards have been collected and 245,000 trees planted thanks to the British public! Since 2012, Marks & Spencer have partnered with the Woodland Trust to collect Christmas cards for recycling in their stores, with the cards collected helping to raise money for the charity. For every 1,000 cards which you drop into M&S stores for recycling throughout January 2017, a new tree will be funded by M&S and planted by The Woodland Trust in the UK.
