FR. BEN GRIST

At the end of Mass last Sunday, I told you that our prayers had been asked for Ben Grist, one of our East Anglia seminarians at Oscott, who had been ordained Priest the afternoon before – much earlier than anticipated, due to his worsening medical condition. He has written a letter to the diocese, which I thought you would like to see.

Dear Brother Priests and Parishioners of East Anglia,

It was out of the rich support & prayers, that I have been able to make this journey from being received into our Mother Church in December 1998 at St.Edmund's Church in Bungay, along my journey of discerning my priestly vocation. The World Youth Days in Rome, Cologne, and Madrid have been essential for fostering a sense of the Diocesan Family in its richness. I recommend any young person who takes their faith seriously to take the 'step' of reaching out beyond their parish garden soil, and make connections that will last a lifetime. Be it in marriage, friendship, or religious 'calling'. Encourage the youth of your parishes.

When Fr.Mark Crisp, Rector of Oscott College, visited my flat last Tuesday, I thought it was to discuss my visit to the consultant at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital the following day. When he asked what I thought about the Sacred Priesthood, I burst into sustained tears, saying 'It is the one thing I desire above all things', thinking at that moment it lay two years off, and perhaps beyond my grasp. Fr.Mark followed this with "Fr.David Bagstaff and I have been in conversation". Little did I know! The true joy of Our Lady at the Annunciation, with unworthiness & trepidation swelled over me. I replied "Leave me for a good cry. It is always easier after a good cry."

What I can only describe as 'a fortress of peace' has been with me these last few days, and has held me. I think that it is the grace of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and his Mother and the Saints. Praise be to God! He is Good! The source of all goodness.
