GETTING READY FOR LENT

Yes, how quickly it has come upon us – but then it always does. Next Wednesday, Ash Wednesday, sees us setting out on this important time in the Church’s Year, when we undertake disciplines that will prepare us for our great annual celebration of the dying and rising of the Lord.

We will, of course, need to give some thought as to what we are going to do personally in order to take full advantage of this season. We will need to make a simple Lent Rule. This should be based on the three ancient disciplines given us by the Lord himself : we will hear them in the Gospel on Ash Wednesday. Prayer, Fasting (self-denial), and

Almsgiving. What are we going to do as regards each one of them? –We need to sort it out before Lent begins, so that we get off to a good start.

A couple of practical things by way of preparation. If you are able to make soup for one of the Lent Lunches, then please put your name down on the rota on the notice board. And if you plan to be part of the Group meeting on Tuesday evenings to look at the document from the Second Vatican Council which we have selected for study, *LUMEN GENTIUM*, the document on The Church, then please, if you wish, buy your copy ; they are in the Sacristy, priced at four pounds.

A LENT SUGGESTION

I don’t know about you, but was very impressed last Sunday by the second reading at Mass – the passage from one of St.Paul’s letters sometimes called his ‘Hymn to Love’. It is a passage that we are all so familiar with, but which when we hear it read, is still able to make an impact on us.

‘Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people’s sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.’ (I Corinthians 13:4-7)

I’ve sometimes heard it said that this passage makes a good basis for an examination of conscience before Confession, but I think it also makes an excellent theme or endeavour for our keeping of Lent. If we could avoid those sins which are contrary to love, and by God’s grace, grow in love itself, then we would be more ready to contemplate the great love of Jesus which moved him to die for us on the Cross, and rise again with new life as his gift to us. The Passion and death of the Lord show us above all else the depths of his love for each one of us. The only way to respond to that love is with love. And St.Paul shows us in this passage what love is and what it is not. I’m hoping to keep this passage to hand, and try to be inspired by it each day of Lent. St.Paul is an excellent spiritual guide for us to have during Lent, and this passage is his gift to us.
