#### HE BREATHED ON THEM.....

There's much to consider and ponder in today's Gospel, which tells of our Lord's appearing to his apostles on the evening of the first Easter Day, and on the following Sunday. Something which we ought to note is St.John's recording of Jesus' words 'For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained'. Here, Our Lord is very clearly giving to the apostles, and to their successors in priestly ministry down the ages, the commission to forgive sins in his name and on his behalf : 'whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven'. This is the scriptural foundation of the Catholic practice of Confession. Someone might ask us 'why do you involve priests in getting forgiven? Why don't you just confess to God directly?' The answer is in today's Gospel : it is Jesus himself who has chosen to forgive us through the ministry of his priesthood. His choice, not that of the Church.
