Let the Children Live! The Lent boxes for *Let* the Children Live!, mentioned in the Parish Lent Leaflet, had not arrived in time for the beginning of Lent, but they are here now, and are on the table at the back of church. Do take one if you would like to do so, maybe to put your loose change in at the end of the day. The custom of having a Lent Box is a good one, and helps us to fulfill the Lenten discipline of Almsgiving. A number of thoughts, suggestions, and ideas emerged from the recent meeting of the Council, and one or two of them might be worth mentioning here.

We found ourselves talking about children in church, and I was asked to urge the parents of young children to bring them to sit near the front at Mass – as many already do. It must be awful as a young child to just to see a wall of adult backs in front of you, and have no view of what is going on at the Altar. I'd have thought that children would be much more restless if they are at the back – and indeed one or two parents have told me that their children seem better able to concentrate when they are sitting near the front. If you are a parent with young children, why not give it a try?

And then it was suggested that we stage some type of 'course' for those who would like to know more about the Faith from the angle of presenting it to others, and answering the questions/objections which are most frequently raised. I wonder what you think about this? It would certainly be very much in tune with the New Evangelisation which the Holy Father is urging us to undertake, and for which we need to be prepared to seize every opportunity which presents itself to talk about the Catholic Faith. I could certainly arrange a series of sessions if you would find them helpful. If you think that you would, please tell me.
