ST.JOHN THE BAPTIST AND ADVENT

Each Advent, there are two Sundays when St.John the Baptist features in the Gospel – on the second and third Sundays. Compared with the one Sunday when we contemplate Our Lady; on the fourth Sunday, we hear in successive years of her Betrothal, Annunciation, and Visitation. This suggests that St.John has a very special relevance

to this holy season.

Well of course John was the last of the prophets, who, for many centuries had foretold the coming of the Messiah. The last, and also the greatest of the prophets: it was his privilege to announce that the longed-for Christ had at last come to God's people. And then also the birth of John points towards the birth of Jesus, in that mysterious, wonderful, circumstances surrounded it. Not, indeed, the virginal conception of the Mother, nor the choirs of angels which hailed the birth of the Christ. But nevertheless, John was born to a mother past the age of childbearing, and his birth, like that of Jesus, was foretold by an angel.

John the last of the prophets, and John conceived himself in extraordinary, even if in not miraculous, circumstances. But most of all John Baptist is so special to this season of preparation for the Christ because of his distinctive message. John bade his hearers to prepare themselves, and we must prepare ourselves, too. He told them to prepare themselves by penitence, and this is just what we need to do. The church tells us how to do this: it is by using the Sacrament of Confession. How sad—and how futile—if our houses and our larders are prepared for Christmas, but not our souls!

"I don't know what to do", some say. "I've nothing to Confess", say others. To the latter, "Are you a Saint then?" "Far from it!" "Then what is it that makes you not a Saint? — that is what you need to confess and have forgiven. When we prepare for Confession, there are two main questions to ask ourselves. 1. What have I done, said, or thought, which doesn't fit in with loving God? And 2. What have I done, said, and thought, which doesn't fit in with loving other people? These are the things which we need to confess. 'Repent, make yourself ready', says St.John the Baptist in this time of Advent. Let us listen to his wisdom, and act upon it.
