News from our Rome Correspondent – "The Easter Octave is over, and we are back in the thick of it as essays, reading and teaching – all of the students here take turns at leading seminars and class presentations – add to the overall workload. But Easter was indeed a blessed time, with all of the Triduum liturgies in-house at the college and being conducted in the spirit of reverence, simplicity and full and active participation by the congregation. We are now enjoying the fruits of Eastertide, and the only slightly worrying aspect of this is the unaccountably tall Paschal candle, which towers around 12 feet over the sanctuary: for what it's worth, I don't think that the daily ritual of lighting it would pass any reasonable health & safety risk assessment, and the rather rickety stepladder used in the process looks less than secure.

For the time being, however, I don't have the dubious honour of carrying out this task. That is reserved for the second year students who were recently instituted as acolytes and so are now involved in most of the serving roles during the liturgy: the ceremony at which second year seminarians become acolytes takes place each spring here at the college, just as the ordination of third years as deacons occurs in June (at the end of the academic year) and the ordination of graduating students from the fourth year as priests occurs shortly after the end of studies in late June or July; this typically takes place in the home dioceses of each seminarian, being carried out by their own bishop.

Us first years have our own milestone next month on May 11th, when we are instituted as lectors (or readers) as the first formal step in our preparation for ministry; and as always I humbly ask for your prayers and thank you for your kindness and generosity in supporting all of the seminarians of this diocese. All of you were very much in my thoughts during Lent and Easter, and I look forward to seeing you again in the summer. Best wishes now and always. *In Christ, Mike Brookes, (Currently enduring the heat of Rome, for which I expect no sympathy at all).*"
