THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Last Friday the universal Church celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Sadly, the Feast wasn't kept well here : more or less just the normal Friday people at the 10.0am Mass , and only four in the congregation at 7.30pm. Why was this sad? What is the significance of this special day in the Church's Year?

It is, of course, a celebration of the Love of Our Lord, of the love which flows from his Sacred Heart into each one of us. The love which has led Him to become man for us, to live, to teach, to suffer, to die, to rise again with that new life which he shares with us, and to send us the Holy Spirit to guide and inspire us. The love which even now refuses to abandon us, however foolish and perverse we may be, a love which is always ready to forgive us, and let us start out anew. This year, the Gospel for the Solemnity concerned the water and blood which flowed out from the pierced side of Our Lord as he hung upon the Cross. The Church has always understood the water and blood to stand for the two great Sacraments of Baptism and Holy Communion, whereby we are born and nourished within the Body of Christ, the Church. And so the Church feels that the wonderful love of Jesus, from which we all benefit so much deserves to be celebrated, and appoints this feast of the Sacred Heart to be an annual thanksgiving for the love of Jesus.

And then of course our own church and parish are dedicated in honour of the Sacred Heart, which makes it appropriate that we should come together on this feast to pray for our local Catholic community here. To ask that we may grow and flourish, and bear witness faithfully to the truth of the Catholic Faith. It is so good that we bear this dedication to the Sacred Heart, which is to the love of Jesus, a reminder of how greatly he values us, and how richly he pours out his blessings upon us. Truly something to celebrate. Which, sadly, we as a Catholic community largely failed to do this year......
