GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER



Famous Last Words

When we are struggling with our faith, we might be tempted to think that as long as we are 'good people' that will suffice. So what sets 'good people' and Christians apart.

The other disciples were really not so very different from Doubting Thomas. When they saw Jesus in their midst, they took some convincing that it really was Jesus and not

a ghost that had come to visit them. The gospel outlines three pieces of proof that Jesus uses to convince them that he really has risen from the dead. He shows them the marks on his hands and feet, he invites them to touch and check that he is flesh and blood, and he shares a meal with them. But it is only when Jesus opens their minds to understanding the scriptures that they come to believe in him. By interpreting what has happened, the risen Christ draws the disciples out of their confusion. Amongst some of his famous last word to them, were words of encouragement to go and preach his message and a reminder of prophecies fulfilled and promises made.

Being a Christian today isn't easy, and simply accepting the Jesus we have grown up with sometimes isn't enough to sustain us. Understanding the difference between living life simply as a good person, and living life as a Christian comes of believing in the risen Jesus. Very often a good person is someone who simply avoids doing anything bad. As Christians we are continually striving to follow Christ's example. Today, through prayer, scripture debate, and putting faith into action, we continually work for the same enlightenment and understanding that Jesus gave his early disciples.

A letter to the Parish – "Around two years ago I decided to make Dereham my home, and this was a providential decision in that it allowed me to become part of this parish community. That has been a great gift to me, because I wasn't moving to Norfolk simply because I liked it here, but also because I felt called to discern a vocation to the priesthood within the Diocese of East Anglia. And you, the people of the parish, have helped me tremendously during this time, whether you know it or not.

A few weeks ago I met with Bishop Alan for the final stage of a year-long process of application, and praise be to God, and despite my mature years (!) I have been accepted for seminary and will be beginning studies in Rome in September. More importantly, I was only one of five men accepted for the diocese, three of

us to enter seminary this year and another two to begin in 2016.

Not every seminarian completes the years of formation required, and I am aware that I am still discerning God's will, just as the Church will be discerning whether I am capable of serving in this way. I believe that I have come this far because of the prayers offered by people here and elsewhere for priestly vocations, and I know that to progress I will still have to rely on the prayers of other people as much as upon hard work and my own prayer life. Ultimately the future is in God's hands, and every good thing is the result of His grace; but I want to thank the parish for being such a welcoming community, and for being a place in which my desire to serve within the diocese was strengthened and nurtured through the example of other people and through your faith in action. Although I will be leaving in a few months' time, Dereham remains my home parish, and I hope to maintain that relationship in the years to come.

Please accept my deepest gratitude for your help and your kindness; and please pray for the seminarians of this diocese, that they may become priests and deacons who can minister to you and with you in the future.
