THIS JOYFUL EASTERTIDE

The childrens' event on Good Friday morning was rather wonderful, and for me formed a very special part of our keeping of Holy Week. It was well attended – quite a number of young families were present this year – and the children, who acted out the events of the Passion and Death of Our Lord did so with great reverence and care. It was really very moving.

But one moment, which was quite unplanned,

remains very clear in my mind. The boy who played Jesus, and did so very well, was, after the Crucifixion, taken down from the Cross, and wrapped in a large linen sheet. He was then carried to the Altar steps - which represented the sepulchre - by Joseph of Arimathea, and laid in the 'tomb'. He remained there motionless for the remaining few minutes of the play, and for the thanks-yous and applause which followed. And then suddenly he sat up, slowly peeled back the sheet, and gave the congregation a radiant smile! It had not been planned – no intimation of the Resurrection had been intended – and yet it seemed to me to be the perfect ending for a childrens' Passion Play; it pointed forward to Our Lord's resurrection, and to the joy of the resurrection, in a wholly appropriate (and charming) way.

In the Gospels, the Resurrection seems to principally elicit surprise, and even unbelief, in the disciples. We don't, sadly, seem to hear of their joy at this wonderful and oh so significant event. It might, of course, be different if the appearance to Peter, which is mentioned but not described, had been recorded, or that appearance to Mary which we feel must have taken place, even though none of the four evangelists tells us of it directly. Maybe Peter and Our Lady were transfixed by joy at what had happened.

But joy, surely, there must have been. It cannot but have must welled up in the disciples once the initial surprise and uncertainty had been overcome. Because this was the most wonderful thing for them and indeed for the whole of mankind which had ever happened - new life, life conquering death, and made available through the Sacraments to all people.

This is certainly a time of great joy for us. Christ is risen! – and we who are his holy people, joined to him by the Easter Sacrament of Baptism, are given the hope of resurrection. Here is the happy ending for mankind, the prospect of sharing for eternity in the Paschal victory of the Lord. So that we too can peel back the shroud of anxiety and fear which often surrounds us, and filled with the joy of Easter, smile out at our brothers and sisters in Christ, and upon all whom we meet. Let us give way to joy. Let it fill us, and flow out from us. Let this be a truly joyful Eastertide, for the Church and for the world. Christ is Risen!
