Courage and Worth

Some people leave their homes and go to work with the poorest of the poor in far flung third world countries but we are not those people. Some people fund raise tirelessly day in and day out for those who are sick or homeless and living in poverty but we are not those people. Some people campaign endlessly to end injustice and cruelty ... but we are not those people. We are not those people! Why not?

We are capable of doing great things, but most of us don't come anywhere near meeting our potential. We are afraid to step out of the comfort zone of our well-worn lifestyles, jobs and homes. We are afraid of the unknown, of failure, disruption and

discomfort. In short, we lack the necessary courage.

In the face of a sometimes hostile and sceptical world, Jesus asks us to have the courage of our convictions. The Church today is built on the courage of those who have refused to compromise their beliefs. Today's gospel urges us to be courageous. "Fear no one," Jesus advises us. Why fear those who can make life temporarily uncomfortable when God has our everlasting interests at heart?

Today's gospel teaches us an important lesson; courage is all to do with self-worth. If you feel you are worthless you are easily intimidated, but if you feel you do have worth, your conviction will lend you real courage. So, do we appreciate our worth? Jesus convinces us that even the sparrows that are two a penny have worth in God's eyes, so how much more worth have we. We have an individual worth to God who has counted each and every hair on our heads. We all have great potential. We all have something to offer no excuses, no exceptions.


Diary Dates for this week - All parish group meetings currently remain suspended.

Open Church: The church is now open for private prayer for two hours every day. We need two stewards to supervise the church each day. There is a list for names of volunteers. Please sign up if you can. It has been wonderful to see people returning to Sacred Heart and St. Margaret Mary for prayer. Hand wash is available at the entrance and we are asked to use it on arrival and departure.

Live Streaming of Mass from Sacred Heart - The necessary equipment for this will be installed on the 29th and 30th of June. From then on, we will be able to livestream Mass, Baptisms, Funerals as we wish. People all over the globe have been able to tune in to Mass because parishes, cathedrals and places of public worship had this facility before

lockdown. We will have it from July onwards.



Ss Thomas More and John Fisher, 22nd June - On the feast day of Ss Thomas More and

John Fisher we are asked to pray especially for those who those who suffer persecution, oppression and the denial of human rights. Consider supporting a charity such as 'Aid to the Church in Need' that champions the needs of persecuted Christians. Aid to the Church in Need supports important projects which are undertaken by the local Church – bishops, priests, Sisters and lay

people – in the 140-plus countries where the charity gives aid. Its focus is on nurturing the faith of persecuted and suffering Christians.

The Birth of John the Baptist, 24th June - John's mission had two facets. First of all, he called people to repentance and baptism. Secondly, he prepared the way for Jesus. In a way he was God's spokesperson. But that's not where it all ends. God's project of salvation is still to be carried out and it doesn't necessarily take a great prophet like John. A prophet is simply a spokesperson, a job each of us could undertake to varying degrees. The ministry of John the Baptist continues in us. St. John's motto was, "Jesus must become more and more.

I must become less and less." He said that he was not even worthy to loosen the strap of Jesus' sandal.
