HAVE YOU GOT YOUR ANSWER READY?

2: 'HOW CAN YOU POSSIBLY BELIEVE THAT BREAD AND WINE BECOME THE BODY AND BLOOD OF JESUS CHRIST?'

Yes, the Catholic agrees, it is extraordinary. Which means beyond, outside, the ordinary. It is something which only God could bring about. It is not the kind of thing which happens in everyday life and experience. But we believe that Jesus Christ IS God – God the Son. And therefore that nothing is beyond his ability to bring about.

How this happens is a mystery, one of the great mysteries of our Faith, along with how God is both Three and One, and how God took a human nature from the Virgin Mother. Things beyond our human power of comprehension. But in our Faith we are dealing not with Man but with God, and so we expect things to be above and beyond our human powers of understanding.

But if the 'how' is incomprehensible to us, the 'why' is clear: the risen, living, Lord, wanted a tangible means by which He could always be close to his greatly-loved people; a means by which he could nourish their souls, and unite them ever more closely to himself. For this means, he chose the Blessed Sacrament of his Body and Blood: bread and wine becoming his true self, so that he could come close, and indeed enter into his people. Food and drink mean both nourishment and pleasure 'Bread for our strength, Wine for our joy', as the hymn says. This is the way he chose. But can it be true? Well listen to what Jesus says in today's Gospel 'For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me, and I live in him.' Ultimately, it all comes down to having faith in Jesus, in his words and his actions. Through faith, we accept what he says, and know it to be true, however strange it may sound.
