GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Buried Treasure - "The Kingdom of Heaven is like a treasure buried in a field; which a person finds and hides again, and out of joy goes and sells all that he has and buys that field."

"The Kingdom of Heaven is like a merchant searching for fine pearls. When he finds a pearl of great price, he goes and sells all he has and buys it."

In both parables both men appreciate the true value of what

they have discovered. Both men are certain about the wisdom of what they must do and are willing to put everything on the line to secure their newfound treasure.

Today Jesus is asking us to determine how much we treasure the Kingdom of Heaven. How valuable is Heaven to us and what are we prepared to do to secure it? Are we prepared to give all we've got and to renounce everything that gets in the way? If the two men in the parables had passed their treasure by or failed to recognise the treasure's value, we would have thought them insane, yet this is how we behave all the time.

All too often we are prepared to let the Kingdom of Heaven slip through our fingers. Perhaps we do this because we have never stopped to reflect on how valuable the Kingdom of Heaven is. Perhaps we have recognised the value of God's Kingdom to us but have forgotten it in the day-to-day distractions of putting meals on the table and paying the bills. Perhaps heaven's rewards seem so distant that we prefer instead to work for more immediate and tangible rewards home improvements, fame, social acceptance and career development. Perhaps we think we can work on God's agenda and our own agenda simultaneously, recognising the value of God's Kingdom but not quite able to renounce our own self-interest. Jesus gives us some concrete advice. He tells us that those who study the scriptures and search diligently will find the discernment to recognise God's treasure and the wisdom to secure it.

Bitesize – Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.



PARISH PRAYER – Father, pour out your Spirit upon our parish. Grant us a new vision of your glory, a new faithfulness to your Word and a new Consecration to your service, that your love might grow among us and your kingdom come, through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Live Streaming of Mass - The feedback that I have received about this has been very positive. It is a service to the parish and it is appreciated by parishioners every day. The system which has been installed is very good and the list of churches which want it is growing longer and longer. It will soon be a normal feature of parish life everywhere that Mass is live streamed.

Guidance for the Celebration of Mass – New guidance from the Bishops' Conference has been received. Please note the following two highlights from the guidance:

- Social Distancing Worshippers should limit their interactions with anyone they are not attending church with, i.e. if they are attending corporate worship with one other household, wherever possible they should maintain social distancing with anyone outside of this group.
- * Face Coverings Face coverings are currently mandatory on public transport and will be mandatory in shops and in supermarkets from 24th July 2020. People are

also strongly encouraged to wear face coverings in enclosed public spaces where there are people they do not normally meet, such as a church. A copy of the full guidance can be found on the parish website.

Christian memory. On that occasion Martha, busily serving the Master, asked him to persuade Mary to help her. Without in any way reproaching Martha, Jesus explained to her that certain souls, called by God, should choose a better part still — the primary duty of listening to him and contemplating him. Some of us are more like Martha - and



some of us are more like Mary; but there is in all of us a built in need to combine the two within us, for without sitting and listening to God our work for God can only lead to anxiety and anger and angst, and without doing the work our faith is clearly nothing.
