
### **GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT**





The recent Taiwan earthquake that left many dead was reported as a tragedy and a natural disaster, but in Biblical times it would have had a different resonance altogether. In Biblical days there were those who feared that disasters were God's punishment on those who had led sinful lives. Jesus sweeps aside the inference. Of course those who have died in disasters have not brought about their own demise. God is not in the business of dishing out vengeful punishments, he is in the business of giving out second

chances and clean slates. Having said that, Jesus' reassurance comes with a word of warning.

What did the victims of the earthquake, and the disasters mentioned in today's gospel reading have in common? None of those victims could have suspected when they left home that morning that they were about to live out their last day. How many of those victims would have lived life differently if they had known they were about to die? Armed with the knowledge of exactly the hour and the day we were to depart this world we would put our relationships in order and live out any unfulfilled ambition. Today's gospel is one of urgency. God gives us chance after chance, but inevitably there will be a last chance and we cannot court spiritual disaster by not being prepared.

So in what ways do we court spiritual disaster? Jesus tells us a parable about a fig tree. The fig tree draws nutrients from the soil for three years, yet bears no fruit. The owner becomes exasperated at how useless the tree is and demands it be cut down, but the gardener suggests giving the tree another chance. We are like that fig tree if we live useless and selfish lives, but God, like the caring gardener in Jesus' parable is always ready to give us a second change and fresh opportunity. The past we are told doesn't have to equal the future. We can change.

Jesus tells us "Repent or perish!" It sounds like a threat but in fact it's a simple reality. We will perish spiritually if we don't live out useful lives. We are invited to look again at skills and talents that up until today we may have ignored, failed to cultivate or used to the wrong ends. How can we live more fruitful lives? How can we become life's selfless givers instead of life's selfish takers?

PARISH PRAYER - Father, pour out your Spirit upon our parish. Grant us a new vision of your glory, a new faithfulness to your Word, and a new consecration to your service; that your love might grow among us and your Kingdom come.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen
