### Celebration of Mass within Church Buildings (continued)

- ➤ Holy Communion must be given silently in the hand only, with the communicant standing and avoiding any physical contact. People should wait in their pews until instructed to move forward to the priest for Holy Communion. When they approach the priest, their arms should be at "full stretch" to maintain distance, with their palms facing upwards, one over the other, and after receiving Holy Communion, return to their seat in an orderly manner.
- Parishioners are encouraged not to linger after Mass.

#### **Guidance for Confession/Penance inside Churches or Buildings**

- Where the church environment allows for confession to take place in an open space (such as a side chapel or other private area), this is preferred.
- ➤ If a glass or plastic screen can be placed between the priest and penitent, this will allow for a face-to-face encounter.
- ➤ Otherwise, the priest and penitent should not sit face-to-face but at *right angles* to each other, or side-by-side, facing opposite directions, while still allowing audibility.
- ➤ If a grille is being used, then it should have a cloth curtain or plastic film cover on the priest's side to minimise transmission risk.
- If a chair or kneeler is used for the penitent, the touchpoints (where the penitent has touched with their hands) should be cleaned after each person. It may make things easier if the penitent is able to stand.
- Penitents should sanitise their hands on entering the church and when leaving.

**Funerals** – From 4<sup>th</sup> July it will be possible to celebrate a Requiem Mass in the church with numbers limited to 30 (as with weddings).

**Concelebration** – further advice for Concelebration at public Masses is awaited.

Guidance for Resuming the Public Celebration of Mass & the Sacraments – The Bishop has written to say it is with relief and joy to hear that the Church is able to resume the public celebration of Mass and the Sacraments from 4<sup>th</sup> July. Guidance has been issued concerning the hearing of Confessions and the public Celebration of Mass. In both cases the importance of maintaining social distancing and hygienic practices is stressed and the means of achieving this are set out in the guidance notes, copies of which are available at the back of church and on the parish website. There are specific rules for priests, sacristans or servers on preparations for and after Mass. A summary of the key guidance points is as follows:

## **Celebration of Mass within Church Buildings**

- Only those necessary should be in the sacristy before Mass.
- Public hymnals and missals should be removed from use.
- > There should be no congregational singing to avoid the risk of passing the virus through the air. However, a soloist or cantor is permissible but social distancing and face covering or Perspex screen should be considered.
- Social distancing should be maintained at all times.
- Readers should be supplied with single-use gloves and should avoid touching the microphones or the Lectionary during the Liturgy of the Word, apart from page turning.
- The Prayer of the Faithful should be omitted.
- There should be no offertory procession of the gifts of bread and wine to the altar; these will be placed on the credence table or the altar before Mass begins.
- Plates or other collecting boxes for cash offerings should be suitably placed at the entrance/exit and overseen by stewards. Such collections to be consolidated into plastic bags, sealed and stored securely for 72 hours before counting.
- There should be no exchange of the sign of peace.
- After the prayer and its response "Behold the Lamb of God ... Lord I am not worthy", the priest will hold up the Host to the congregation and say audibly "The Body of Christ", to which the people should respond "Amen".
