News from the Diocese of East Anglia -

- Catholic churches across East Anglia close doors Following the Prime Minister's historic announcement on 23<sup>rd</sup> March strengthening restrictions in an attempt to combat the spread of COVID-19, all Catholic churches in East Anglia are now closed to the public until further notice. - The Diocesan Curia offices in Poringland closed The Diocesan Curia offices at Poringland are also now closed until further notice, in line with Government Coronavirus restrictions. Office landlines will not be answered or have answerphone facilities. You should contact the appropriate person via the email addresses listed on the Diocesan's <u>contacts page</u> on its website. We are also asked to refrain from sending cheques to the office until further notice.
- Chaplains launch online activities for young people As the UK goes into lockdown, the School Chaplains, the Diocesan Youth Team, the 17<sup>th</sup> Norwich Scouts and Jane Crone from CAFOD have united to launch an online resource for young people and their families. They have begun producing a free Daily Reflection and links to fun activities for all ages.
- Walsingham Shrine begins livestreaming The National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham has opened a new website and 24/7 live streaming service to keep Catholics connected to its cycle of prayer. The new service has been created in time for people to connect online to the ceremonies for the Re-dedication of England as the Dowry of Our Lady next Sunday, March 29.
- CAFOD provides online Sunday liturgy for children The CAFOD education team has put together an online children's liturgy which families can use at home during the current crisis when public Masses are suspended.
- Catholics can obtain free online access to Mass readings The Catholic magazine Magnificat has responded to the current Coronavirus crisis by waiving the subscription to its online version. The link for accessing Mass readings is: <u>https://us.magnificat.net/free</u>
- Events around the Diocese which have been cancelled or postponed A number of high-profile events around the Diocese of East Anglia have been cancelled or postponed following the measures put in place on March 16 by the Prime Minister in an attempt to contain Coronavirus. These include the annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Walsingham (which is due to be rescheduled for later in the year), the Children's Pilgrimage to Walsingham at the end of May and the Ignite Festival at Swaffham, also in May. The Chrism Mass, on Tuesday April 7, will now not be open to the public and will instead be captured in words, pictures and video and be posted online soon afterwards. More details of this will be carried on the diocesan website <u>www.rcdea.org.uk</u> as soon as possible. The first Caritas Festival, which was due to be held at St George's in Norwich on March 28, has also been cancelled.
