FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Next Sunday, the First Holy Communion programme gets underway in a formal kind of way, when the children and their parents take part in the Mass of Enrolement and Commitment. It seems that this year about a dozen children will be taking part in the preparation, slightly more than last year. The First Holy Communions take place next July.

This year we are inviting the parents to take a more active part in the programme. We are asking them to commit one hour on a Saturday morning to coming along to church with the children: to be with them at the Childrens' Mass, supporting them by their presence, and then when the children go off with their Catechists for the second half-hour, to come over to the Presbytery for coffee and for their own time thinking about the Faith. Some weeks, I hope, we will discuss – in a very relaxed way - what the children are thinking about that particular week in their group, and some weeks we will think in more general term about what it means to be a Catholic Christian. All this begins this coming Saturday, the day before the Mass of Enrolement and Commitment. It is something to which I personally am looking forward to very much. Preparation for First Holy Communion should always involve Children, Priest, and Parents, and this seems to be a good way of doing that.

COMING SHORTLY

I've already alerted you to the Bishop's visit here on Friday, October 11th, for the **CONFIRMATION** - a very special event in our Calender, and one which I'm hoping everyone will make a special effort to take part in. And also the **AUCTION OF ITEMS AND PROMISES** on Friday, October 18th, marking the conclusion of the Year of Faith with a major attempt to raise money for good causes.

And now there is another item in our Autumn programme which I'd like to tell you about. This is three evenings for the Parents of young children, to take place on Tuesdays October 15th, October 29th, and November 12th. These fortnightly evenings will give the parents of young children an opportunity to think about and discuss three very important topics. The first is how one can best introduce ones young child to the idea of God, a God who has made us, and who loves and cares for us. Where does one begin? And what resources are available to help the parents? The second evening will be devoted to how to effectively introduce ones child to prayer, which is so vital in the individuals relationship with God. And the third will be devoted to the difficult and controversial subject of children at Mass. How does one best combine the interests of the child with those of other worshippers? How firm or how free should the parent be? How can the time at Mass be both enjoyable and instructive for the child? It will be good to share and discuss peoples own experiences.

For each of the evenings, I've invited an experienced and sympathetic leader to come from outside; they will share ideas with us, and initiate discussion. We've not done anything like this before, so we will just have to see whether it meets a need. I've invited the other priests in the Deanery to make these evenings known in their parishes, in case any of their parishioners would like to join us. They would be most welcome.
