#### **GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR TRINITY SUNDAY**

## Shaped, Taught and Driven by God



Imagine for a minute a god who created us but then left us to our own devices, or a god that gave us a purpose in life but didn't give us the strength or drive to carry out that purpose. When we speak the sign of the Cross we speak of God the Father who made our world and everything in it. A God who made us what we are and then set out everything we need with the precision of a master chef's kitchen. When we speak of God the Son, we speak of a God who gave our lives

purpose and meaning through his teaching, his miracles, but most of all, by his shining example. And when we talk of God the Holy Spirit we talk of the power of God that is with us always, ready to be called upon, enabling us to do great things when our human powers are simply not enough.

It's wonderful to know that we have been created by God, shaped by Jesus and guided by the Spirit. We have to share this realisation with other people. "Go therefore," Jesus tells us in today's gospel, "and make disciples of all nations baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit... and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you..."

We tend to feel a bit uncomfortable about evangelising, and for good reason. Evangelising is something that can be done very badly, but there are little things we can all do that can be very effective. We could for instance begin by helping someone back to church who doesn't bother any more ... perhaps by offering them a lift. We could take one of the Catholic papers round to someone who is too elderly to attend Mass anymore to help them stay involved and in touch. We could invite non-Catholic friends to get involved in the next Catholic Aid Agency event, whether it be a fun run, a hot pot supper or a campaign. Or we could simply lead by example, getting involved in something we are passionate about and making positive changes to one other person or a community of people somewhere in the world. However we choose to evangelise, remember God's promise, "I am with you always, to the end of the age."

PARISH PRAYER - Father, pour out your Spirit upon our parish. Grant us a new vision of your glory, a new faithfulness to your Word, and a new consecration to your service; that your love might grow among us and your Kingdom come.
