GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE 3RD SUNDAY OF EASTER



Meeting Jesus

Two disciples travel along the road to Emmaus talking about recent events in Jerusalem. They are feeling helpless and defeated in the wake of Jesus' crucifixion. Perhaps they were still strongly tied to the Jewish expectation of a Messiah, and had little understanding of Jesus' divinity. They simply saw Jesus' death as a crushing defeat. Perhaps our own stories aren't too

different. We often feel defeated and helpless, unable to see what Jesus' death and resurrection could mean for us. Do we spend long periods of depression, unable to appreciate God's presence in our lives? One thing is for sure; it would be nothing short of a tragedy if we got to the end of life's paths without meeting Jesus, so how should we go about it?

Notice in today's gospel that Jesus opens the eyes of the two disciples on the road to Emmaus very gradually. The two travellers don't recognise Jesus straight away, but their hearts warm to him as he helps them to see recent events in the light of scripture. As he interprets what has happened, he gives them hope in the future and a clear vision of new opportunities. Then when the couple invite Jesus to stay, and he breaks bread with them, they come to realise who he really is. What a life changing moment that must have been!

This story is clearly not just for the benefit of the two travellers or even for the first disciples; this story is for the benefit of us all. We might think that we've been going to church long enough to have heard it all before, but there's always something new to learn. Today we are invited to meet Jesus in the Eucharist, and to re-find Jesus in the way we understand and interpret the scriptures. Take up the challenge.

Restored Permission for the Reception of Holy Communion under both Species - The Bishops of England and Wales have endorsed this restoration, permissible from the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. For this parish, I recommend that the restoration commences on the feast of Corpus Christi (11th June), allowing more time for preparatory catechesis. I believe that a refreshment of understanding will bring great fruit regarding the nature of the Holy Eucharist, the reverent reception of the Sacrament (on the tongue and on the hand), the correct language to be employed in reference to the consecrated species etc. Much will be gained from a re-examination of the G.I.R.M.

Eucharistic Ministers Meeting – With the recent statement of the Bishops Conference of England and Wales on reinstating Communion with the Chalice, there will be a meeting for all Eucharistic Ministers on **Wednesday**, **24**th **May 2023 at 1630**, with a view to their being recommissioned on the feast of Corpus Christi on Sunday, 11th June at the 1100 Mass.
