If you Love Me

Jesus' 'farewell discourses' are a bit like a teacher's final lesson before an exam packed with important advice. "If you love me, you will keep my commandments." "Love one another as I have loved you." "The Spirit of Truth will abide with you when I am gone."

Love of course is key to all Jesus' last-minute advice. There's lots we already know about love from our own relationships. If we love and care about each other we say where we are going and what time will be back home. If we love each other, we don't keep secrets or have affairs. If we love each other, we put our loved one's needs before our own. It's the same with God; we show God we love him by keeping his commandments. Commandments aren't there

to create unnecessary discipline; they are there to keep us in love with God and with each other.

Jesus knew that once he was gone some of his commandments would become less clear. Two thousand years down the line there are many issues that have grey areas, such as euthanasia, and the sciences that govern nuclear energy or fertility. For instances such as these, Jesus left us an 'Advocate' a 'Spirit of Truth'. We are promised that the 'Spirit of Truth' will guide us through all of life's difficult decisions. Jesus left us with hope and help, now it's down to us.

International Mass: Sunday, 28th May – Our International Mass will be taking place on Pentecost Sunday, 28th May, at the 1100 Mass, followed by a bring and share and BBQ in the Presbytery garden. Time to wear our national costumes!

Altar Alterations - We are most grateful for being blessed with a Church which is liturgically proper in terms of design, with the Blessed Sacrament at the centre. However, one structural flaw is the dimension of the Altar Table which makes it a bit off. If you notice, the length is not quite fitting to the size of the sanctuary making it a bit cramped. Plus its width is narrower than usual. In the near foreseeable future, we shall have a Parish consultation on this matter alone. The Altar is the most important part of the Church for it is where the Sacrifice of Christ takes place. In our case, this could be improved.

Parish Teams - Under the structure of the new parish pastoral committee, a number of parish teams are being formed to address and manage areas of concern in the parish and to take the initiative for its growth. The names of these teams are suggestions only at this stage and their permissions are still to be agreed.

The Emmaus Room - This is in urgent need of re-decorating. Some volunteers have already washed down the walls but we need a couple of volunteers to paint the walls. Paint and equipment will be provided. Please let Fr jay know if you can help or if you are willing to contribute towards the cost of the paint.

Ascension Thursday: Real and Present - On this day we imagine Jesus going to some place high above the clouds, to some faraway place beyond death. But if the disciples felt any sense of abandonment that's certainly not how they acted. The disciples didn't leave the scene of the Ascension in mourning; they returned with great joy and praised God in the temple day after day. It is clear that the disciples did not experience Jesus as absent. It is clear that in everything they did from then on that Jesus was real and present in their lives.
