GOSPEL REFLECTION FOR THE 11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Relationship is Key

We are invited for a health check at our medical centre. We know we are out of shape and that we will probably get a bit of lecture! The health practitioner takes us through a check list. How much do we drink? How much do we smoke? How much exercise do we take? How much fruit do we eat? Then we are given a bit of advice and a leaflet on healthy living. We stuff the leaflet in a pocket and escape. Any good counsellor will agree that issuing someone with a list of do's and don'ts is rarely helpful. That's not how change works. Key to facilitating change is relationship. When we talk to people and work out what is important to them and what they are struggling with, only then can we really help or be helped.

In today's gospel Jesus encourages his disciples to go out amongst the people to seek out the lost and remove the obstacles between them and God. He didn't send out the disciples in a spirit of judgment, but a spirit of empathy. Empathy and relationship are essential when it comes to helping someone to change. Jesus was able to change people's lives simply by the way in which he related to them and he asks us to do the same.

So how do we respond to Jesus' command to share what we have learned? Do we try to impose our views on others whether they like it or not, or do we take time to gain genuine and sensitive insight to make relationship key.

Saint Thomas More, 22nd June - In 1534, Thomas More, with his close friend, St. John Fisher, refused to render allegiance to the King as the Head of the Church of England and was confined to the Tower. Fifteen months later, and nine days after St. John Fisher's execution, Thomas More was tried and convicted of treason. He told the court that he could not go against his conscience and wished his judges that "we may yet hereafter in heaven merrily all meet together to everlasting salvation." And on

the scaffold, he told the crowd of spectators that he was dying as "the King's good servant-but God's first." He was beheaded on July 6, 1535. On this feast day we are asked to support prisoners of conscience or those who are persecuted. Consider today supporting a charity such as 'Aid To the Church in Need' or 'Amnesty International'. Support those who are imprisoned or persecuted simply for their beliefs.

Renewed Ukraine appeal following flooding - Ukraine is facing yet another humanitarian emergency with the destruction of the Nova Kakhovka dam. Thousands of people have been forced to leave their homes and Christian Aid's local partners say there is now a risk of disease from water contaminated by dead animals and sewage. Teams in Ukraine have been working around the clock, since the dam was blown up on June 6 2023, to ensure fresh water supplies reach survivors. According to the UN, around 80 towns and villages have been flooded with 17,000 people affected. It is feared this could rise to 40,000. Consider donating online this week via one of our Catholic Aid Agencies or Christian Aid.

Refugee Week, 19th-25th **June 2023: Simple Acts -** This week we are encouraged to look at ways to broaden or change our perspectives. This week we are asked to do something simple to learn about other people's stories or other people's cultures. This might be as simple as watching a film, reading a book or sharing a meal. Aim to make this a simple act that the whole family can share.
